6.21.24 THEOLOGICAL HOPE: BRIDGE TO FREEDOM AND BULWARK AGAINST TYRANNY IN THE THOUGHT OF JOSEPH RATZINGER

Pope Benedict XVI may be best remembered for his vast contributions to Catholic thought in scripture, theology, and liturgy. His insights, however, in the field of political theory are no less profound. As we suffer the chaos of our tumultuous age, we can benefit from reflection on Joseph Ratzinger's understanding of authentic and sustainable political freedom. Ratzinger held that the theological virtue of hope stood as a defense against tyranny. Set against his broader analysis of modern gnosticism, Ratzinger's convincing argument acts like a lighthouse: as a caution but

also a beacon. Fr. Mark Doherty, President-Rector of St. Patrick's Seminary in Menlo Park, CA, will present a synopsis of Joseph Ratzinger's political theory and show that Church is not one player among many on the field of civil discourse but rather the central reality of history, eternal and temporal.

He currently serves as pastor of St. Michael Chaldean Church in El Cajon, CA, and does a lot of ministry on social media as well. His faith has been formed by the rich patristic tradition of the Chaldean Church, which is one of the 23 Eastern

Rites of the Catholic Church. In his presentation, he will help us better understand the story of the Annunciation of the Birth of Jesus from the perspective of Mar Narsai, one of the great fathers of the Chaldean patristic tradition, who presents the story as a longer dialogue between Mary and the Angel Gabriel with the intention of portraving Mary as

a contemplative who is ready to accept God's plan for her life.
