

10 FACTS ABOUT ST. ANTHONY OF PADUA

ONE

St. Anthony is known as the patron saint of lost items:

TWO

St. Anthony's Feast Day is June 13th:

Each year on June 13th we honor his life and work.

THREE

St. Anthony died when he was only 36:

He was canonized just one year after his death.

FIVE

St. Anthony became friends with St. Francis of Assissi:

After training as a priest St. Anthony joined the Franciscan Order and came to the attention of St. Francis, the founder of the Franciscan Order.

SIX

St. Anthony's relics are enshrined at the Basilica of St. Anthony in Padua, Italy:

Pilgrims can venerate St. Anthony's incorrupt tounge in a glass reliquary.

SEVEN

St. Anthony is a Doctor of the Church:

St. Anthony is one of more than thirty Saints with this title for his profound contributions that benefit the Church.

EIGHT

St. Anthony holds the Child Jesus:

St. Anthony is depicted holding Jesus due to a mystical experience where the Christ child appeared to him.

NINE

St. Anthony's name was Ferdinand:

When St. Anthony became a Franciscan, he took the name of Anthony after St. Anthony of Egypt.

TEN

St. Anthony entered religious life at age 15:

Initially St. Anthony lived in an Augustinian monestary. Eight years later he received permission to become a Fransiscan.
